The 2009 U.S. Annual Alumni Meeting for the German Chancellor Fellowship will be held in Chicago, Illinois from Friday, April 24 until Sunday, April 26.

The meeting, organized by John Maciuika (1998-1999), will focus on the theme “Architecture and Cities.” Speakers will discuss various dimensions of “Theory” and “Practice” in city planning and architecture, including the “greening” of the urban environment.

Humboldtian Appointed as U.S. Secretary of Energy

Humboldt Research Award winner Steven Chu has been appointed as U.S. Secretary of Energy by President Barack Obama. Dr. Chu is a distinguished expert in climate change and a driving force in the use of renewable energies.

Winner of the Nobel Prize for physics in 1997, Dr. Chu received a Humboldt Research Award in 1994



and spent several months in 1996 at the Max Planck Institute (MPI) of Quantum Optics in Garching. His host at MPI was Dr. Theodor Hänsch, a Humboldt Foundation Research Award winner and Nobel laureate (2005).

Since 2004, Chu has been director of the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory in Berkeley, California. He has a B.S. in physics from the University of Rochester and a Ph.D. from the University of California, Berkeley.

New Humboldt Alumni Award

The Humboldt Foundation has created the Humboldt Alumni Award to provide support for a conference series or research networking activities which promote relations between Germany and the home countries of Humboldt alumni.

The award is a partnership with the German Foreign Office and the *Stifterverband für die deutsche Wissenschaft* and is one of the ways in which the Humboldt Foundation is contributing to the Foreign Office's 2009 research and academic relations policy initiative. Every year, up to three awards will be granted, each valued at up to 25,000 EUR. The award ceremony will be held in Berlin during the Humboldt Foundation's Annual Meeting in June. **The application deadline is April 20, 2009.** For additional details and applications see www.humboldt-foundation.de/web/alumnipreis.html.

Humboldt Foundation Partners in 2009 Year of Research and Academic Relations Policy

The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation is partnering with the German Foreign Office, the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), and the German Archeological Institute to make 2009 the year of research and academic relations policy (*Aussenwissenschaftspolitik*). The initiative is intended to further strengthen international academic and scientific exchange with Germany. The initiative includes additional support for existing scholarship programs and alumni relations as well new programs, including the opening of four new “German Science and Innovation Houses” in Moscow, Tokyo, New Delhi, and Sao Paolo. Sofja Kovalevskaja Award

Preparations for the next selection round for the Sofja Kovalevskaja Award are now underway. The award provides exceptionally talented young researchers up to 1.65 EUR to pursue innovative projects at an early point in their careers.

The next announcement for applications is planned for the first half of the year 2009. The deadline for applications will probably be in early 2010 and selection meeting in early summer 2010.

Submit an application if you are a successful top-rank junior researcher from abroad, have **only completed your doctorate with distinction in the last six years**, and have published work in prestigious international journals or publishing houses. The Sofja Kovalevskaja Award allows you to spend five years building up working groups and implementing a high-profile, innovative research project of your own choice at a research institution of your own choice in Germany.
